Report Title:	Amendment to Scheme of Reservation and Delegation (SoRD)	

Purpose of report

To seek approval to amend the Scheme of Reservation and Delegation to align fully to the existing Remuneration Committee's terms of reference with regards to determining the arrangements for termination and any special payments.

Key points

Following a request nationally for all Integrated Care Boards to review their Remuneration Committee terms of reference and delegation to enact the necessary arrangements with regards to redundancy approvals and necessary payments.

A review of the ICB's Scheme of Reservation and Delegation (SoRD) and Remuneration Committee terms of reference identified that whilst provision was already included in the committee's terms of reference, the wording in the SoRD was not consistent in clearly referencing termination arrangements and special payments to staff. Therefore, to align the SoRD with the Committee's terms of reference, it is requested that the following entry be added to SoRD under the relevant human resources section:

However, agreement has been received from the Audit Chair and committee members via email and it will be formally reported to the next Audit Committee meeting in January 2026.

Please note that no other amendments are requested, the full SoRD has not been included on this occasion but can be made available upon request.

There is a risk that if the ICB does not reflect the changes needed to its key governance documents this will not enable Remuneration Committee carry out its intended role
