The North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (ICB) in partnership with The North East and Cumbria Learning Disability Network (NECLDN) have developed the following flu vaccination toolkit to support NHS and local authority communications leads, GP practices, community pharmacies and voluntary sector organisations to help increase awareness and uptake of flu vaccinations for people with a learning disability.

The <u>learning disability flu vaccine toolkit</u>, created to help support the national flu vaccination programme and the ICB winter campaign 25/26, provides content aimed at people with a learning disability, and their families/carers, and is designed for sharing across social media and other communication channels.

It is being led by people with lived experience of a learning disability, carers, consultants, GPs and pharmacists across the region. All content has been checked for accuracy by The North East and Cumbria Learning Disability Network.

More content and case studies will be added to the campaign as it develops to ensure that an increasing diversity of people will be represented.

Background

Why the flu vaccine is important for people with a learning disability

Flu can make people feel very unwell. For some, it can lead to serious health problems. People with certain health conditions, including those with a learning disability, are more at risk.

People with a learning disability can often face more challenges with their health. They may be more likely to catch the flu, and it can lead to more serious illnesses.

The 2022 LeDeR report (Learning from Lives and Deaths – People with a Learning Disability and Autistic People) showed that breathing problems were a leading cause of death in people with a learning disability. It found that 23.8% of avoidable deaths in this group were due to respiratory illnesses such as pneumonia.

This is why children and adults, who have a learning disability, are considered 'at risk' and are entitled to a free flu vaccine through the national flu vaccination programme.



As well as getting the flu vaccine, anyone with a learning disability should attend their Annual Health Check. This helps identify any health issues early and ensures they receive the right care. Getting vaccinated and having regular check-ups can make a real difference to their health and wellbeing.

The campaign will feature 'trusted voices', people with lived experience of a learning disability, their carers, and local GPs. They will share positive, relatable stories to help others feel confident about making informed choices. The campaign will also direct people to trusted sources of information.

All organisations providing NHS or adult social care services have a legal duty to follow the <u>Accessible Information Standard</u>. This means they must make sure that people with a learning disability, impairment, or sensory loss get information in a way they can read or understand, with support if needed. This helps everyone to communicate effectively with health and care services.

Campaign Aim

• To increase awareness and uptake of flu vaccinations for people with a learning disability and their carers.

Campaign objectives

- To use 'trusted voices' to help reassure people with a learning disability and their carers that the flu vaccine is safe.
- To let people with a learning disability and their carers know that the flu vaccine is the best way to protect against becoming seriously ill from the flu.
- To guide people towards trusted sources of information, such as <u>Gov.UK Flu vaccinations</u>: <u>supporting people with a learning disability</u>
- To encourage conversations with 'trusted voices', such as respiratory consultants, GPs and pharmacists, about the flu and the importance of the flu vaccine.

Key flu messages for people with a learning disability

- If you catch flu, it can make you very poorly.
- It is safe to have your flu vaccine.



- Having your vaccine will help you to stay healthy A vaccine is a medicine that helps your body fight diseases. Vaccines are very important. They can protect you and those around you from getting very ill.
- It is important to get your flu vaccine to stop you getting very poorly.
- The flu vaccine does not always stop you getting the flu. But if you do get the flu your symptoms will be milder
- If you do not get the vaccine, and you get the flu you could get very ill and may have to go to hospital
- You can ask your GP surgery to do things to make your appointment easier for you. This is called a reasonable adjustment.
- You can take a family member or friend along with you to get your flu vaccine.
- You can get the flu vaccine for free if you are on the learning disability register.
- If you think you have flu, stay home and rest until you feel better. Call NHS 111 if you have other health conditions or feel very unwell.
- While at the doctors getting your flu vaccine, ask about having your annual health check when it's due. Annual health checks
 are free and can help you stay fit and healthy.

Why trusted voices?

Evidence from the ICB's 2024 vaccines in pregnancy campaign showed that our 'trusted voices' approach was successful.

By featuring real midwives, and mothers, from across the region, we helped reassure pregnant women that vaccines before and during pregnancy are safe, effective, and important. Sharing positive, relatable stories and giving women clear, confident information helped them feel more in control of their choices. Backed by the trusted NHS name, this approach led to more women choosing to get vaccinated, with uptake rates higher than the national average.

We hope that using the same trusted voices approach to support people with a learning disability, clearly showing that the flu vaccine is easy to get, safe and works well, will also lead to more people getting protected.

Flu vaccine - helping people stay well this winter

Every winter, lots of people catch the flu. Flu is a virus that can make people feel very poorly.

People with a learning disability are more likely to get very ill if they catch the flu. That's why it's important for them to have the flu vaccine.

The flu vaccine is a quick injection that helps protect people from getting very sick from flu. It is free for anyone with a learning disability and for their carers - like a family member or support worker.

You can get your flu vaccine at your doctor's surgery or at a pharmacy. You can bring someone with you for support, like a friend, carer or family member.

Flu spreads easily and is worse than a cold. It can make people feel very unwell, and sometimes people with flu need to go to hospital.

Having the vaccine helps protect you and others around you. After the injection, some people might feel a little bit hot, have a sore arm or feel tired—but this is much better than getting the flu.

The flu vaccine is quick, easy, and helps keep you safe.

Doctors in the North East and North Cumbria are urging people with a learning disability, and their carers, to get their free flu vaccine this winter.

Flu is a serious illness that can make people feel very unwell.

For people with health problems, including a learning disability, flu can be much more dangerous, causing serious problems like pneumonia and breathing problems, and can sometimes be fatal.

Children and adults with a learning disability are more vulnerable to flu and are eligible for a free flu vaccine as part of the annual national NHS winter flu vaccination programme.

Dr Catherine Monaghan, respiratory consultant and medical director for the North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (ICB), explained: "Flu is much more than just a cold and it can lead to serious health problems, especially for people with a learning disability who often face more challenges with their health.



"The flu vaccine is a safe and simple way to protect yourself and others and can help prevent serious illness, reduce the chance of having to go to hospital, and most importantly, save lives."

The 2022 Learning from Lives and Deaths, People with a Learning Disability and Autistic People (LeDeR) report, showed almost a quarter (23.8%) of avoidable deaths among people with learning disabilities were caused by respiratory illnesses, like pneumonia, highlighting the vital role vaccines play in preventing serious illness.

As well as getting the flu vaccine, people with a learning disability are also being encouraged to book an annual health check, which helps spot any problems early and ensures the right care is in place.

"The flu vaccine is a quick injection and it's free for people with a learning disability and their carers", added Dr Monaghan.

"It's available to book at GP surgeries or local pharmacies and you can take a family member, friend or carer with you to the appointment. Your GP can also make your appointment easier, which is called making reasonable adjustments, to help people feel more comfortable when they have their vaccination.

"Getting the flu jab is one of the best ways to stay healthy this winter so if you or someone you care for is on the learning disability register, please talk to your GP or pharmacist today to get a free flu vaccine".
