Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request for Information - NHS North East and North **Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)**

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 4 April 2024 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

NENC ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the 5 councils that make it up - Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar & Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

Your Request

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I would like to request information held by North East and North Cumbria ICB.

Last year The Newcastle upon Tyne Hospitals NHS FT (NuTH) were successful in bidding for NHSE funds to cover a regional approach that allows for all 8 providers across the North East and Cumbria Region to benefit from a two-year contract with HealthCall for digital solution supporting virtual wards, with 200 concurrent beds for each organisation. Roll out of the single solution supposed to start early September.


1. Could you please confirm if the HealthCall solution has been rolled out for virtual wards?
