Report Title:	Finance, Performance and Investment (FPI) Committee Highlight Report and Approved Minutes				

Purpose of report

To provide the Board with an overview of the key points and approved minutes from the FPI Committee meeting held on 3 April 2025.

Key points

The Finance, Performance and Investment Committee, chaired by Jon Rush, Non-Executive member of the Board, met on 3 April 2025.

May, June, July and August Committee meetings have been stood down because of the prioritisation of the national Strategic Commissioning Transition Programme 2025/26. The next Committee meeting is planned for 4 September 2025.

The key points to bring to the Board's attention are:

Finance:

- Update provided on latest Integrated Care System (ICS) 2024/25 financial position at month 11
 including potential financial risks and progress being made in identifying further mitigations to
 manage the system position but felt achievable
- Update on the financial sustainability group (FSG) received.

Performance

- the integrated delivery report which provided an ICS overview of quality and performance using data covering January 2025 and February 2025
- Elective care The number of long wait patients had reduced with no more than 17 waiting in excess of 78 weeks and 140 for 65 weeks.
- There had been a significant improvement in the Cancer 62-day standard position at North Cumbria Integrated Care (NCIC) NHS FT with support from the ICB, mutual aid and additional NHSE non-recurrent funding
- Diagnostics centres are due to open in Cumbria and Tees Valley later in 2025. The impact of all
 this additional capacity will not be visible until 2026-27. The challenges of financial setup costs
 was raised due to a variance in funding expectations.

Learning Disability Performance review

Presentation received as part of a series of deep dives which focussed on specific areas of performance challenge and ongoing work being undertaken with the transforming care programme.

Committee Effectiveness review 2024/25

A review of the committee's effectiveness for 2024/25 was presented and Committee assured business undertaken had been in line with good governance during the year.

Risks and issues

- Significant underlying recurrent financial pressures continue to be evident, which present a challenge to delivery of balanced financial plans for 2024/25.
- There is an overarching risk of failure to deliver operational planning objectives as outlined in the corporate risk register.
- The Committee are not compliant with the terms of reference as a requirement to meet at least10 times a year

Assurances

- ICB finance teams will monitor and report monthly on the risks
- The financial position of both the ICB and the wider ICS will continue to be reviewed in detail on a monthly basis by the Finance, Investment and Performance Committee
- Work is progressing on the 2025/26 financial plan

The Board is asked to receive the confirmed minutes of 3 April 2025 for assurance purposes.
