**Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request for Information – NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)**

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 4 April 2024 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

NENC ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the 5 councils that make it up – Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar & Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

**Your Request**

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to request copies of any email or WhatsApp correspondence to or from the medical director or equivalent of your health board or integrated care board - including any correspondence sent via their PAs or secretaries – since 1 April 2021, containing the following terms within the body of the email or any attachments:

Long Covid AND, any of the following:

Nice OR National Institute for Health and Care Excellence guidelines; GMC OR General medical council; Medicalise; Psychological; Functional; Psychosomatic; Fabricated OR FII.

If it is not possible to provide the information requested due to the information exceeding the cost of compliance limits identified in Section 12, please prioritise correspondence by email. If further refinement is needed, please prioritise the most recent correspondence working backwards.

If you can identify any ways that my request could be refined, I would be grateful for any further advice and assistance under the Section 16 obligations of the Act.

If you have any queries please don't hesitate to contact me via email or phone and I will be very happy to clarify what I am asking for and discuss the request. My details are outlined below.

## **Our Response**

On this occasion it is not possible to provide the requested information. In line with your rights under section 1(1)(a) of the Act to be informed whether information is held, we confirm the ICB does not hold any of the information requested.

The correspondence you requested was checked from 1 July 2022. The reason for this is that NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board did not become a legal entity until this date.
