## Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request for Information - NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 21 February 2025 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (the ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the five local authorities of Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

## **Your Request**

I would like to submit a Freedom of Information request to understand the Learning Disabilities and Prader Willi support offered by your Integrated Care Board to adults aged 18-64.

I am looking for information on care provided in both Residential care and Supported living settings.


The data I would like to request is the following, for the financial years ending March 2022, March 2023, March 2024 and the period April 2024 to December 2024:

For adults 18-64 with Learning Disabilities:

- 1. The number of people supported in:
  - Residential care settings
  - Supported living settings
- 2. The number of new placements made in:
  - Residential care settings

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- Supported living settings
- 3. The average weekly fee across all people supported in:
  - Residential care settings
  - Supported living settings (the portion of the fee relating to the care support)
  - Supported living settings (the portion of the fee relating to the housing support)
- 4. The average weekly fee across new placements only in:
  - Residential care settings
  - Supported living settings (the portion of the fee relating to the care support)
  - Supported living settings (the portion of the fee relating to the housing support)
- 5. For placements in residential care settings, what was the proportion of placements with an average weekly fee above £3,000, split by:
  - All placements
  - New placements
- 6. For placements in supported living settings, what was the proportion of placements with an average weekly fee above £3,000 (total), split by:
  - All placements
  - New placements
- 7. For placements in residential care settings, what was the proportion of placements with an average weekly fee above £2,750, split by:

  - Residential care settings
  - Supported living settings
- 5. For people 18-64 with Prader Willi Syndrome, what was the proportion of placements with an average weekly fee above £3,000, split by:
  - All placements

- Where the care setting is "in-area" (the local area covered by the Local Authority)
- Where the care setting is "out-of-area" (outside the local area covered by the Local Authority)

## **Our Response**

We can confirm, as per Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the ICB holds some of the information you have requested. This is detailed in the attached spreadsheet.

NENC ICB does not hold the level of detail to provide a breakdown for new placements. On this basis, we cannot respond to your question 2 and 4 and can only part answer questions 5 to 10. NENC ICB does not hold information specifically for Prader Willi Syndrome
