<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request for Information – NHS North East and North</u> <u>Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)</u>

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 4 June 2024 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (the ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the five local authorities of Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

Your Request

I am enquiring about targets related to Children and Young People's (CYP) mental health services.

- 1. What was the ICB's target for the number of CYP accessing support through NHS funded community mental health services in 2023/24, as aligned with the MHS95 metric: Number of CYP aged under 18 supported through NHS funded mental health with at least one contact (12 month rolling)
- 2. Was this achieved? Please provide the total number of CYP accessing support through NHS funded community mental health services in 2023/24 as aligned with the MHS95 metric above.
- 3. Has an indicative target for CYP accessing support through NHS funded community mental health services (MHS95 or alternative) been set for 2024/25? Please could you advise on what this target is?

Our Response

We can confirm, as per Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the ICB does hold the information requested.

For North East North Cumbria ICB, concerning the metric '*Number of CYP under 18 supported through NHS funded mental health services receiving at last one contact*':

- 1. The target for 2023/24 was a monthly average of 53,245, calculated quarterly, against a national ambition of 60,897.
- 2. The ICB internal target was achieved. Monthly average stood at 58,200 as of March 2024.
- 3. A monthly average target of 59,632 has been set for 2024/25, calculated monthly, against a national ambition of 60,897.

In accordance with the Information Commissioner's directive on the disclosure of information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 your request will form part of our disclosure log. Therefore, a version of our response which will protect your anonymity will be posted on the NHS ICB website https://northeastnorthcumbria.nhs.uk/.
