# Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request for Information - NHS North East & North Cumbria Integrated Care Board.

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 12/12/2022 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

For information Clinical Commissioning Groups ceased to exist on 30 June 2022. Services that were previously delivered by the CCG are now being delivered by the successor organisation NHS North East and North Cumbria (ICB). This covers the areas of County Durham, Newcastle Gateshead, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland and Tees Valley.

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

## Request

In relation to last financial year (21/22) could you please provide me with information relating to the first 20 occasions in which you sanctioned the use of a patient's Personal Health Budget (PHB) to be spent on something that was NOT for the provision of care, medicine, or transport to a place where care or medicine was provided?

- 1) For each of these 20 occasions please state:
- (i) what the money was spent on and
- (ii) how much money was spent on it and

(iii) the outcome the patient was working towards as a result of this spend.

Note: What I am after is any capital expenditure which is not immediately apparent as of a medical purpose. So a specialist bed would be medical and I would not want to know about it, but a large screen television for a patient with vision problems would be something that I am interested in, as somebody not familiar with the case would not be able to tell that the set had been bought because of the patient's vision problems. The request covers PHBs for both adults and children.

## Response:

Please be advised that some localities (referred to as 'place') within the NENC ICB cannot confirm or deny if the requested information is held, as doing so would exceed the appropriate limit as set out in section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. Section 12 of FOIA allows a public authority to refuse to deal with a request where it estimates that it would exceed the appropriate limit. The appropriate limit is currently £450 for the NHS based on a flat rate of £25 per person per hour.

The reason section 12 may not have been applied to the whole request is due to the integration between the disbanded Clinical Commissioning Groups and the inception of the Integrated Care Board from the 1<sup>st</sup> of July 2022, whereby integration is still taking place across the services and therefore, some localities have easier access to this information and do not need to apply the section 12 exemption.

#### North Cumbria:

In accordance with section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, we have estimated that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

The appropriate limit is specified in the regulations and is set at £450 for NHS bodies. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending more than 18 hours work in determining whether the ICB holds the information and location, retrieving and extracting the information.

To confirm this information would require a manual search of 91 patient PHB records, including support plans and reviewing each piece of expenditure to confirm if any of the funding meets the requested criteria. It is estimated that each patient record would take approximately 15 minutes per record. 22.5 hours  $x \,£25$  per hour = £568.75

With regards to your request, the ICB can confirm that all information within your request falls outside of the appropriate limit and therefore, cannot be provided; however, please be advised, you also have the option to pay.

# North Tyneside:

There are four cases identified as per the requested criteria:

- 1) i. Sky Tv installation
  - ii. £800 per annum
  - iii. The aim is to prevent social insolation whilst on 15 hours bed rest per day.
- 2) i. Hot Tub
  - ii. £3500 (approx.)
  - iii. To help minimise anxiety and behaviours.
- 3) i. Day care
  - ii. £6360
  - iii. To provide carers relief and sensory input
- 4) i. Day care
  - ii. £7758.40
  - iii. To attend rebound sessions and sensory rooms.

# South Tyneside:

# Sunderland:

There is one case identified as per the requested criteria:

- 1. i. Budget for replacement clothing, bedding, and furnishings
- 2. ii. £230.15 per week
- 3. iii. To maintain dignity and comfort as a result of a health and social care reason but may not be immediately apparent is for this for someone not familiar with the case.

## Tees Valley:

In accordance with section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, we have estimated that the cost of complying with the request would exceed the appropriate limit.

The appropriate limit is specified in the regulations and is set at £450 for NHS bodies. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending more than 18 hours work in determining whether the ICB holds the information and location, retrieving and extracting the information.

To confirm this information would require a manual search of 290 patient PHB records, including support plans and reviewing each piece of expenditure to confirm if any of the funding meets the requested criteria. It is estimated that each patient record would take approximately 15 minutes per record. 72.5 hours x £25 per hour = £1,812.50.

With regards to your request, the ICB can confirm that all information within your request falls outside of the appropriate limit and therefore, cannot be provided; however, please be advised, you also have the option to pay.

In line with the Information Commissioner's directive on the disclosure of information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 your request will form part of our disclosure log.
