<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request for Information – NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board</u>

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 20 February 2023 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

For information Clinical Commissioning Groups ceased to exist on 30 June 2022. Services that were previously delivered by the CCG are now being delivered by the successor organisation NHS North East and North Cumbria (ICB). This covers the areas of County Durham, Newcastle Gateshead, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland and Tees Valley.

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

Request

I understand that, in relation to the nurses' potential strike action taking place from Wednesday 1 March to Friday 3 March, all ICBS were asked by NHS England to provide "a brief assessment of the impact of the proposed [strike] action upon acute, mental health and community Trusts and their own directly provided services", by midday Monday 20 February.

I am requesting, under the freedom of information act, a copy of the assessment sent by your ICB to NHS England.
