<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request for Information – NHS North East and North</u> <u>Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)</u>

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 26 February 2025 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (the ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the five local authorities of Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

Your Request

I am writing to you under the Freedom of Information Act to request answers to the following questions:

- 1. Does the ICB currently have a regional unified patient health record strategy? (N.B. this is not the same as a Shared Care Record a unified patient health record specifically centralises all patient data streams, including clinical data, across the ICB's various systems)
- 2. If yes, does the ICB use a Unified Health Data Platform (as defined above)?
- 3. If not, does the ICB have plans to develop a regional unified patient health record, defined as above, within the next 5 years?
- 4. Is the ICB using OpenEHR or have an OpenEHR strategy?
- 5. Does the ICB have a Clinical Data Repository (CDR)?
- 6. If yes, is this bidirectional (read-write as opposed to read-only)?

Our Response

We can confirm, as per Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the ICB holds some of the information you have requested.

- 1. NENC ICB does not currently have a regional unified health record strategy, we have a Digital Data and Technology (DDaT Strategy that describes our Shared Care record approach, utilising an interoperable Health Information Exchange (HIE), delivered in our Integrated Care System (ICS).

- 3. NENC ICB has no current plans to develop a regional unified patient health record in the next 5 years.
- 4. No, NENC ICB is not using OpenEHR and has no OpenEHR strategy.
- 5. NENC ICB does not have a Clinical Data Repository (CDR).
