<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request for Information – NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)</u>

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 02 August 2023 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

- For children and young people with Tourette's and Tic's at present, treatment can be sought through the Northumberland Graduated Response Approach via Northumberland County Council as it is in-line with treatment for anxiety.

For adults (over the age of 16 years), Northumberland's NHS Talking Therapies provider, Talking Matters Northumberland (TMN) do offer interventions for people who are experiencing Tourette's. There are two threads of intervention:

- A. Focused sessions on managing stress, anxiety, and depression, recognising that stress and anxiety can make symptoms worse and also acknowledging that there may be an adjustment response that the client would benefit from talking through.
- B. Behavioural therapy focused on reducing tic's, such as habit reversal and exposure with response prevention.
