Stay safe buying medicines online!

Prescription medicines are strictly controlled for a reason – taking them without advice from a doctor or pharmacist can be **very dangerous**.

⚠ Medicines might be **expired**, **diluted**, or something completely different.

⚠ They can cause harmful side effects or react badly with other medicines.

⚠ Some fake medications can even be **fatal**.

✓ Always talk to your **GP** or **pharmacist** first. They'll help you understand what you're taking and how to take it safely.

✓ If you do buy online, make sure the pharmacy is registered with the General Pharmaceutical Council

2. Stay safe buying medicines online!

Not all websites selling medicine are registered pharmacies.

Buying medicines from unregistered online pharmacies could be **dangerous**!

⚠ The medicines may be **out of date**, **fake**, or **not right for you**.

They could cause harmful side effects, react badly with other medicines you're taking - or even be fatal.

- ✓ Talk to your GP first. They know your medical history and can advise you.
- ✓ If you do buy online, make sure the pharmacy is registered with the General Pharmaceutical Council

3. Stay safe buying medicines online!

Taking ANY medicine should always be done with advice from a **GP or pharmacist**!

Buying medicines online can be risky!

X Some websites sell medicines that are fake or haven't been checked by a pharmacist.

They could cause harmful side effects, react badly with other medicines or even be **fatal**.

✓ If you do buy online, make sure the pharmacy is registered with the General Pharmaceutical Council
