## Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request for Information - NHS North East and North **Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)**

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 4 November 2024 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (the ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the five local authorities of Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

## **Your Request**

This request relates to shared care agreements or protocols with NHS gender services (clinics or pilots). I request the following information:

- 1. Does your integrated care board have a shared care protocol or agreement in place with any NHS gender services? If so which ones?
- 2. The ICB's shared care protocol or agreement with NHS gender services.
- 3. What is the ICB's policy on hormonal prescribing for the treatment of gender dysphoria in primary care?
- 4. The number of complaints the ICB has received since January 1st, 2024, from patients that relate to the prescribing of hormone replacement therapy for the treatment of gender dysphoria in primary care and the nature of these complaints.

## **Our Response**

We can confirm, as per Section 1(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the ICB holds some of the information you have requested.

- 1. NENC ICB does not have a shared care protocol or agreement in place with any NHS gender services
- 2. Please refer to the response to question 1.
- 3. The ICB's policy on hormonal prescribing is currently out of date and a new policy is in development. It is expected that the new policy will be finalised by March 2025.
- 4. Since 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024, there have been three formal complaints. The nature of these queries relates to ongoing prescribing of hormone treatment.
