<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 – Request for Information – NHS North East and</u> <u>North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)</u>

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 12 September 2023 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

NENC ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland and Tees Valley (which covers the 5 councils that make it up – Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar & Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

Your Request

I'd be very grateful if you could provide the information below:

- 1. The number of referrals made to the Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder clinic for each year, for both adults and children, from 2013 to 2022.
- 2. The number of referrals made for Autism assessment for each year, for both adults and children, from 2013 to 2022.
- 3. The number of ADHD referrals (for both adults and children) that were passed to external providers who offered remote assessment.
- 4. The number of Autism referrals (for both adults and children) that were passed to external providers who offered remote assessment.

- 5. Of the ADHD referrals handled by NHS providers, what proportion resulted in a positive diagnosis of the condition in question (for both adults and children)?
- 6. Of the ADHD referrals handled by external providers, what proportion resulted in a positive diagnosis of the condition in question (for both adults and children)?
- 7. Of the Autism referrals handled by NHS providers, what proportion resulted in a positive diagnosis of the condition in question (for both adults and children)?
- 8. Of the Autism referrals handled by external providers, what proportion resulted in a positive diagnosis of the condition in question (for both adults and children)?
- 9. What proportion of ADHD assessments carried out by Psychiatry UK on behalf of the NHS resulted in a positive diagnosis of ADHD (for both adults and children)?
- 10. What proportion of Autism assessments carried out by Psychiatry UK on behalf of the NHS resulted in a positive diagnosis of Autism (for both adults and children)?
