Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request for Information - NHS North East and North **Cumbria Integrated Care Board (NENC ICB)**

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 12 August 2024 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (the ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The ICB covers the areas of County Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland, and Tees Valley (which covers the five local authorities of Darlington, Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees).

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

Your Request

Please could you provide the following information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

- 1. The amount allocated to the ICB under the Elective Recovery Fund (ERF) for each of the years 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24.
- 2. For each of the financial years 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24 a breakdown of expenditure and activity of the ERF according to the different categories of elective care. Please use the relevant HRG codes to set out expenditure and activity for each of the above financial years in relation to the Elective Recovery Fund allocation. For background, our intention is to understand how the elective recovery fund has been spent on different types of care within each ICB in England.
- 3. For each of the financial years 2021-22 2022-23 and 2023-24, a breakdown of expenditure of the ERF on each category of elective care according to the provider organisation. Please use the relevant provider organisation codes used by NHS Digital and NHS England along with the HRG codes for each category of care. For background, our intention is to understand how the elective recovery fund has been spent on different types of providers – for example, NHS Trusts and Independent Sector providers.
